# The nature of the assurance

This is a report by Corporate Citizenship for the management of SEGRO.

Corporate Citizenship has undertaken and independent assurance of SEGRO's 2021 GHG Emissions Data against the WRI / WBCSD Greenhouse Gas Protocol, 2015 revised edition, as described below:

The assurance covers the period from 1/10/2020 to 30/9/2021.

SEGRO is entirely and solely responsible for the production and publication of the data assured, and Corporate Citizenship for its assurance.

The data relates to SEGRO's owned and leased facilities under its operational control across all geographies.

GHG quantification is subject to inherent uncertainty due to factors such as incomplete scientific knowledge about the global warming potential of different GHGs and uncertainty around the models and parameters used in estimating GHG emissions.



This engagement was performed in accordance with the International Standard on Assurance Engagement (ISAE) 3000 (Assurance Engagements other than Audits or Reviews of Historical Financial Information) and the relevant subject-matter specific ISAE for GHG data (ISAE 3410, Assurance Engagements on Greenhouse Gas Statements).

The carbon emissions data has been prepared using the WRI / WBCSD Greenhouse Gas Protocol, 2015 revised edition, and the appropriate GHG conversion factors for company reporting as published by UK Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA), Association of Issuing Bodies European Residual Mixes 2020 and the International Energy Agency (IEA), along with supplier-specific emissions factors.

Corporate Citizenship has complied with the requirements for independence, professional ethics and quality control as stipulated by ISAE 3000.

## Assurance work performed

The assurance work was undertaken across January 2022 to February 2022. Detailed records were kept of meetings and correspondence relating to the assurance. A team of three, led by a Technical Director, undertook the assurance and commentary process. A Director acted as adviser to the project.

Corporate Citizenship's work has involved, but not been limited to, the following elements:

- 1. In-depth management interview with key persons at SEGRO in order to understand SEGRO's processes for management, reporting and performance improvement in these areas;
  - a. Scope 1 emissions
  - b. Scope 2 emissions (Location-Based)
  - c. Scope 2 emissions (Market-Based)
  - d. Scope 3 emissions; all relevant categories<sup>2</sup>
- 2. Conducted an in-depth meeting with the Measurabl team (specifically Clare Havenhand, Customer Success Manager) and with the SEGRO MRI team to ensure data collection processes and systems.
- 3. Attended regular Teams calls with the SEGRO and Inenco team (specifically Thomas McLaren & Jack Shepherd) to ensure data collection process and system.

- 4. A review of underlying data sources and substantiating evidence to support this year's reporting, to assess robustness of monitoring and reporting systems;
- 5. A review of year-on-year environmental performance trends to identify any significant changes in operational eco-efficiency and investigate the reasons behind these trends;
- 6. A review of GHG calculations for accuracy and consistency with best practice guidelines; and
- 7. A review of group-wide data consolidation and reporting to check for errors or omissions in data analysis, consistency with underlying data sets and reasonableness of reporting.
