

About the site

SEGRO Park Hackney Wick is at the heart of a vibrant neighbourhood, which in the 10 years since the London Olympics has seen an exciting mix of new residential development, creative spaces, and businesses call it home.

Whilst the Olympics brought much needed investment and regeneration to the area, it also displaced a range of businesses. Many of these businesses provided services, produced goods or enabled goods to be moved to homes and local businesses. In a growing city, the demand for these goods and services have only increased, and so the need for modern industrial space is rising.

The site has a long history of being used for industrial purposes, although in recent years the site has been vacant and had been left in a poor state of condition until SEGRO took ownership of it last year.

We believe that a new, sustainable urban warehouse development on Wick Lane will continue the site's industrial heritage in a contemporary way, responding to modern business needs, the environment and the evolving character of Hackney Wick.





Our vision

Based on the opportunities presented by the site and the evolving needs of the local area, SEGRO's emerging vision is focused on the benefits of urban warehousing.

Our proposals include:



Two new urban units totalling 49,500 sqft



Improved landscaping, including urban greenery



Flexible spaces suitable for a wide range of businesses



A highly sustainable, low carbon development utilising green technology to minimise its impact locally



On-site amenity space, including break-out areas and wellness space for employees



An opportunity to provide an enhanced bus stop next to the site, making using active travel easier and more comfortable








Proposed site plan

The scheme design has been configured to respond to the local context and to appeal to businesses who want to provide a high quality working environment for their staff and operate their workspace in a sustainable way.

The site plan below shows the layout of our current proposals including the two site entrances - one directly onto Wick Lane and one onto the nearby Crown Close.

Creating a suitable design

The architectural approach and materials SEGRO and the project team propose seek to celebrate the area's industrial heritage and reflect the ongoing evolution of the area.

We want to ensure that our plans appeal to a wide range of sectors now and in the future, which is why the proposed buildings are designed to offer flexible spaces that can be fitted out in a variety of ways to suit different business needs and activities.

We will be delivering new and improved green landscaping to create an improved outlook for our nearest neighbours, as well as a balcony and roof terrace to provide those working at the new facility with break out areas and wellness spaces. SEGRO has sustainability at the heart of everything we do, and we will be encouraging staff working at SEGRO Park Hackney Wick to cycle, walk, or use public transport, as well as providing electric vehicle charging points.


